- “Some changes. Largest was conviction regarding dating relationships and changes she made once she returned home.”

- “When she came home, she rated camp a ‘10’ on a 1-10 scale. She didn’t really like the rest time each afternoon, but that was her only negative comment. She said she definitely wanted to go back next year, until her older sister returned from young life camp and she found out they have boys there! We’ll see!”

- “I was very pleased with every aspect of taking her to camp and picking her up. Your staff is awesome! I wish there was a camp like this for my sons! (There is: Deerfoot Lodge!)
- “I could not have possibly imagined a better experience for my daughter! She is determined to save her allowance to pay for camp next year because she doesn’t want to take this experience away from another scholarship candidate! Thank you!”
